GETTING TO GOOD: Using technique, form and published poetry to advance your own writing

Fridays: May 5, 12 & 19, from 5:30 to 7 pm

Ever wondered what a villanelle is? A pantoum? A responsive poem? Maybe you already know — but you'd like to learn how to launch or develop your skills as a poet, as well as become more competitive in the literary marketplace.

Discover with published, local working poets Marea Gordett and Susan Comminos how to realize your ambitions as a writer in one of two workshops (Beginner/Advanced Beginner, and Intermediate/Advanced) focused on similar verse forms, but using distinctive approaches.



Developing poets will enjoy Gordett's gentle and supportive approach to getting material on the page and shaping it into a poem. More advanced poets will enjoy Comminos's technical and analytic approach to prompting, shaping, and polishing poetry. We ask participants to submit three poems for review prior to the workshops, to help determine which group is best suited for you. Susan Comminos is an award-winning poet whose work has appeared in the Harvard Review Online, Rattle, Subtropics, TriQuarterly and The Common, among others. She's previously taught at The Univ. of Michigan, RPI and the Arts Center of the Capital Region.

It begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction and risk avoidance, while progressing on to the basics of hands-on defense training. It is not your typical self-defense course, where the student learns how to punch or kick through repetition; rather, it is designed for the student to survive attacks.

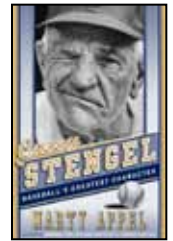
Marty Appel on his latest book:

Drug Take-Back Day

Saturday, April 29, 10 am – 2 pm

The Guiderland Public Library and the Guiderland Police Department are teaming up for the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration's nationwide Drug Take-Back Day, a one-day collaborative effort between the DEA and state and local law enforcement agencies focused on removing potentially dangerous controlled substances from our nation's medicine cabinets.



A national take-back day provides a unified opportunity for the public to surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction. The program provides an opportunity for law enforcement, prevention, treatment, and the business community to collaborate and establish a safe collection site and brings a national focus to the issue of pharmaceutical controlled substance abuse.



Medications CANNOT be left at the library prior to April 29.

Medications may be turned in to the police officers in the library's auxiliary parking lot from 10 am - 2 pm on April 29 only.

What CAN be disposed:

- Controlled, non-controlled, and over the counter substances
- Medication in its original container or removed from its container and disposed of directly into the disposal boxes. (If an original container is submitted, be sure to remove any identifying information from the prescription label.)

What CANNOT be disposed:

- No sharps and syringes

Drug Take Back Day officials will not ask questions of nor request identification from anyone.

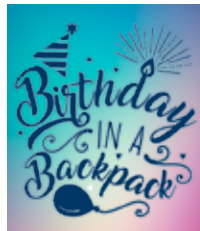
